

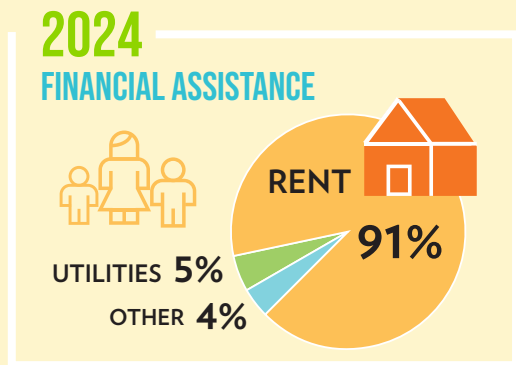
# 2024 IMPACT REPORT

## OUR MISSION

360 Communities® delivers **safety and stability** that improves lives.

A safe and stable home is a defining difference to achieving positive outcomes in the lives of the people we serve. It is an essential bedrock that empowers greater focus on life goals like health, employment, and school success.

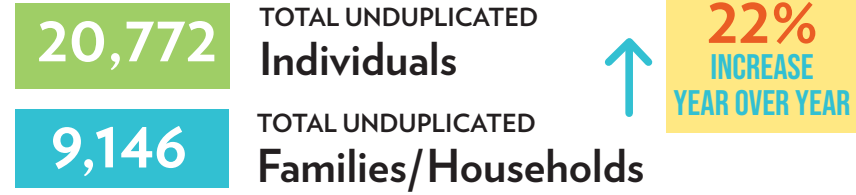
We delivered **\$1,191,592** in financial aid to support people's long-term safety and stability.

In 2024, 360 Communities increased safety and stability for



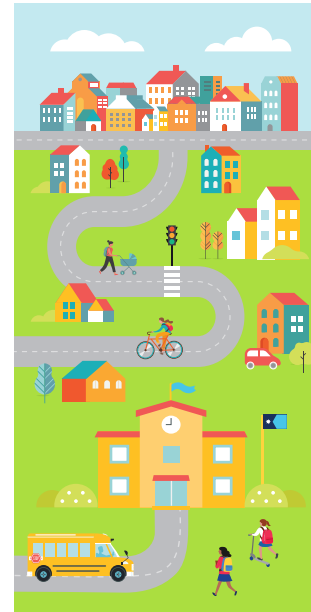
## PROVIDING RESOURCES TO PREVENT HOMELESSNESS

360 Communities was recognized with multiple awards for our expanded programming that reduced homelessness and increased housing stability.

With targeted financial aid, we prevented evictions, secured housing for students and their families, and maintained housing for those experiencing financial hardships. We also provided safe shelter for people fleeing domestic and sexual violence.

Strong partnerships with the eviction court system, school districts, Dakota County, and the broader community made this work possible.

In all, we supported the housing stability of **5,090 individuals** from **3,117 households** with innovative and holistic solutions.

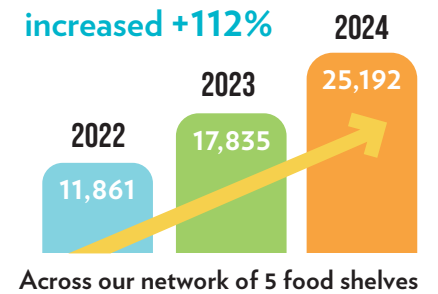
to **13,978 people** through our network of **5 Dakota County food shelves** and **2 resource centers**.

## SAVED LIVES | REDUCED DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE | HELPED SURVIVORS HEAL

### Our Violence Prevention & Intervention Advocates:

- Intervened to prevent future violence and promote healthy relationships with **2,230** individuals.
- Provided emergency safe shelter at Lewis House for **277** individuals fleeing domestic violence. **More than half** were children.
- Advocated for **192** victims of sexual assault, including **18** children.
- Served **1,716** individuals on an outreach basis; answering calls to the crisis line, following up on police reports, and much more.
- Provided domestic and sexual violence awareness education for **3,542** community members.

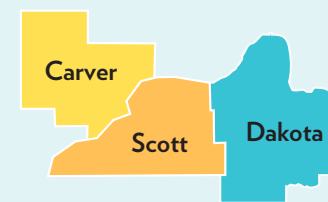


## INCREASED GRADUATION RATES | IMPROVED EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

Our Partners For Success® Family Support Workers supported families in **20** schools across **5** school districts in Dakota County

We helped **1,104** students stay on track toward high school graduation, including **35** high school seniors who graduated in 2024.

- 87%** of students with academic goals improved or stabilized performance.
- 69%** of students with attendance goals achieved their goals toward improved attendance.
- 80%** of families with housing stability goals attained their goals toward stabilized housing.



Our **Child Care Aware** program for children ages **0-5** covers Dakota, Scott, and Carver counties.

Our coaches equipped **219** child care providers with skills that improved early childhood development for **6,807** children.



**797** volunteers provided **54,175** hours of meaningful service to support our mission.
